**QUESTIONS:** Answer each thoroughly and completely.

- 1. Summarize each main point of Ralph's speech.
- 2. What is the purpose of his speech—what is he trying to accomplish with it? Does it work?
- 3. Explain the different opinions about each of the following: the beast; fear; ghosts. Why is it so important that they discuss and decide the existence and nature of these elements?
- 4. Why does Percival cry? What is the significance of him stating his full name and address?
- 5. What do you think Simon means when he says maybe the beast is "only us?" Does his opinion on the matter make much of an impression?
- 6. Explain the symbolism of Piggy and Jack fighting over the conch.
- 7. All of this conflict is happening as it grows dark. Why is the darkness symbolically important?
- 8. Why are things breaking down so badly that not even Ralph and his charisma or Piggy and his reason can save them? What is overpowering them?
- 9. In the end most of the boys follow Jack and join the chant. Why do they follow him? What might this foreshadow?
- 10. Which 3 boys are left apart from Jack's group? What might the significance of this be? What might it foreshadow?
- 11. Explain the basic differences between these two groups. What does each stand for?
