### Distinguished (4)

- o Several key thematic topics are accurately defined
- For each key thematic topic, the author's opinion on that topic is accurately defined
- Of the various theses defined for a piece, the most significant thesis is identified, the one which most clearly guides the entire piece
- Appropriate CD is cited which strongly support the interpretation of thesis
- o A deep, nuanced understanding of the pieces is shown

## Strong/Solid (3)

- Several key thematic topics are accurately defined
- For each key thematic topic, the author's opinion on that topic is accurately defined
- Of the various theses defined for a piece, the most significant thesis is identified, the one which most clearly guides the entire piece
- Appropriate CD is cited which strongly support the interpretation of thesis
- A less nuanced understanding of the piece is indicated by the thesis defined for the piece

### Basic (2)

- Several thematic topics are accurately defined
- For each thematic topic, the author's opinion on that topic is accurately defined
- The thesis chosen may not be the most central idea to the piece
- CD is cited to support the interpretation of thesis, but it is not particularly convincing
- A simplistic understanding of the piece is indicated by the thesis defined for the piece

## **Unsatisfactory (1)**

- Thematic topics are mistaken for theses
- **o** Theses defined are inaccurate
- No CD provided to defend interpretation of thesis
- $\circ \quad \textbf{No accurate understanding of the piece demonstrated}$
