Exercise #3:

- 1. Explain exactly why you put the items where you did.
- Explain exactly why you left out the items you did.
- 3. Write 2 or 3 rules that define the organizational principles you are using here.

Principles:

- 1. The further right you indent, the more specific the information must be.
- 2. Each item must relate directly to the item it is indented under; this way everything will relate to its topic sentence and to the thesis.
- 3. #1 is the thesis; #2's are topic sentences; #3's are usually "Concrete Details/CD's/Examples, though this is not always the case.
- 4. Ones can become twos, twos can become threes, or vice versa, etc.

- 5. Theoretically, there is no limit to how far to the right or how far down an outline can expand
- 6. You need to keep going to the right until you have a CD/example; then, you indent one step further for your "Commentary"/analysis.

NOTE: this is a format for highly structured, highly formal essays which require very tight organization. This is highly formulaic and you will, hopefully, eventually break away from this strict structure; this will happen ONLY after you have mastered this!
