A. Thesis

- 1. Is it clear and concise?
- 2. Is it in an appropriate place?
- 3. Does the essay focus on it 100% of the time?

- B. Topic Sentences
 - 1. Is there one present in each body paragraph?
 - 2. Is each clearly stated and does is define a specific idea?
 - 3. Does each accurately define the contents of the paragraph?
 - 4. Does each clearly relate to and support the thesis statement?
 - 5. Does all information in a given body paragraph relate to the topic sentence?

C. CD

- 1. Does the essay contain the correct number of CD/chunks?
- 2. Is each CD a quote or a specific event?
- 3. Is each CD explained in sufficient detail?
- 4. Does each CD support the topic sent?
- 5. Are the proper number of quotes present in the essay?
- 6. Is each quote embedded?
- 7. Are the absolute very best CD selected, or does it appear the writer picked "any old CD" that worked?

D. CM

- 1. Is CM thoughtful? Does it show a sophisticated understanding of the CD?
- 2. Is CM focused, or does it drift off topic?

3. Is CM thorough: does it make it absolutely clear how the CD related to every aspect of the TS and the thesis?

- 4. Is proper CD/CM ratio followed?
- 5. Is there evidence of weaving CD and CM?

E. Introduction

- 1. Is the thesis the last sentence?
- 2. Is an effective introduction technique used?
- 3. Is there appropriate and clearly stated background info?
- 4. Are all stated requirements of intro followed?

F. Conclusion

- 1. Is thesis statement restated?
- 2. Are specific key points clearly and thoroughly summarized?
- 3. Does conclusion go beyond mere summary? Does it broaden out?
- 4. Is a sense of closure established by the conclusion?
- 5. Are all stated requirements of the conclusion followed?

G. Transitions/Direct References

- 1. Are they used in all required places: each new BP, CD, idea?
- 2. Are transitions authentic? (Do they show how one idea relates to another?)
- 3. Are a variety used?

H. Sentence Structure

- 1. Clearly mark any sentences that are fragments, run-ons, or for some reason do not make sense.
- 2. Are a variety of sentence lengths and structures used throughout essay?
- 3. Is sentence structure purposely varied at times for an intended effect?

I. Word Choice

- 4. Mark all slang words, 1st or 2nd person words, redundant, words, tired words, and wrongly used words.
- 5. Are all verbs active and interesting?
- 6. Does it appear words are chosen with care?
- J. Editing/Conventions
 - 7. Mark all spelling errors
 - 8. Mark all punctuation errors
 - 9. Mark all capitalization errors
 - 10. Mark all usage errors

K. MLA

- 1. Are all formatting specifications followed?
- 2. Are all CD cited?
- 3. Do citations contain the correct information?
- 4. Is Works Cited page formatted correctly?
- 5. Are all necessary sources present on the Works Cited page?
