4. Cite and analyze 2 examples of "loaded language," a specific element of diction.

5. Cite and analyze one example of metaphor.

6. Cite and analyze one example of allusion.

6. Cite and analyze 2 other rhetorical devices of your own choice different from the techniques above.

7. Cite and analyze 2 different rhetorical fallacies in Henry's argument.

8. Compare this piece with the Declaration in the following areas:

1. Which piece uses more logos? More pathos?

2. What is the audience of each piece?

3. What are the differences in rhetoric used by each author?

4. Do the differences in rhetoric make sense given the purpose of each writer and given the audience of each?

5. Is one piece more effectively persuasive than the other?
